


# Final comparative results AEF JUVENTUD PROJECT for ANONYMOUS TEST - GENDER VIOLENCE AND US




At the first question it can be seen that Portugal leads with 86,50%-YES and 13,50%-NO. Followed by Italy with 79%-YES and 21%-NO. Next, we have Romania with 77%-YES, and 45%-NO. In Spain we can observe that the gap between the two is the smallest: 48%-YES; 45%-NO. So, excluding Spain, we can say that most students live in stable families with both parents.


The next question is answered by Romania with a majority for "well approved"-

85%, followed by ''enough approved"-14% and other small percentages of answers. The rest of the countries also answered mostly with ''well approved'': Portugal-79%; Italy-70%; Spain-69%. Malta has the lowest percentage for ''well approved''; (50%), and the biggest percentage for: "almost refused''(15%); ,,not very approved"(11%); others (11%). We observe that most consider that are the best approved when they are with their friends.




## 3. Who do you think is most fortunate in society?


## 4. Have you ever heard about a case of gender violence in your school?

Focusing on school area, we have 75% of people in Malta who haven't heard of gender violence in schools, followed by: Italy-72,5%; Spain-60%; Portugal 59,5%. In Romania there are only 34%-NO answers. The percentage of 66% "YES" answers puts Romania on the top of the list for gender violence witnessed in schools.






Questioned whether they find beauty an important aspect in a romantic relationship, the answer with the highest percentage was the same for all countries: "ENOUGH". Romania is at the top of the list with 71% followed by: Portugal-45%; Spain-41%; Malta-40%; Italy-35%. The next general opinion was that beauty matters "little" : Portugal-30%; Spain-26%; Romania, Malta, Italia-12%. Italy is standing out with a precent of 26% of students who answered that beauty matters "A LOT" and 0% "NOTHING". #### 7.Importante of compatibility in a sentimental relationship.




The importance of compatibility in a relationship was answered by Portugal with 80% for "A LOT", followed by: Italy and Romania-63%; Spain-54%; Malta-38%. The answer "ENOUGH"is present 33%-Malta; 25%-Romania and Spain; 23%-Italy; The highlights of this question are for the answer "NOTHING", where Malta has the biggest percent (12%) and Italy the smallest (0%). #### 8.Importante of understanding each other in a sentimental relationship




The following question lays down the importance of understanding each other in a sentimental relationship. All 5 countries had a majority answer for "a lot" Portugal leading with 90% followed by: Romania-85%; Italy-79%; Spain-72%; Malta-66%. "Enough" was answered with under 20% for each country (19%-Italy; 18%-Spain; 18%-Spain; 16%-Malta; 10% Portugal) and the percentages for "little" and "nothing" are under 5% for each country, Portugal actually having 0%. Understanding is also a significant part in a sentimental relationship in the mind of young people.




Solidarity as an important factor in a relationship was answered in two main ways. The biggest percentages of answers were for "A LOT" starting with Portugal-70% followed by: Romania and Italy-56; Spain-53%; Malta-46%. The second most voted answer was "ENOUGH", this time Romania and Spain having the biggest percentage: 31%. At this question Malta has 7% answers for "NOTHING" and Portugal 0% for "LITTLE". 


The importance of friendship in a sentimental relationship was handled pretty similar in each country with small changes in Malta and Italy. Thus, we have Portugal who answered "A LOT" with the vast majority of 93%; Spain-65%; Romania-59%. In Italy and Malta the situation was treated almost in half. In Malta we have answers 50% for "A LOT"; 33% for "ENOUGH". In Italy "A LOT" was voted by 48% and "ENOUGH" by 38%. The other answers were debated with small percents, Romania this time answering with 0% votes for "NOTHING". We can observe that friendship it's the second, if not the main criteria when it comes to forming a sentimental relationship.




When asked about the importance of fidelity in a sentimental relationship, Portugal students answered almost unanimously with "A LOT", with a percentage of 96%, followed by Italy-87%; Spain-82%; Romania-80%; Malta-69%. 
Honesty as being important in a relationship was approached by each country differently, but the majority still voted " A LOT" of importance for honesty. We have 93% portugese students who answered "A LOT"; 87% in Italy; 82% in Malta; 77% in Spain; and 62% in Romania. ### 13. Importante of independence in a sentimental relationship




At this question the opinions were almost positive but a small percent in each country still voted negatively. Portugal voted in precent of 52% for "A LOT" almost the same as Malta, Spain and Italy. Italy also answers in a significant percent for "ENOUGH" (46%), same as: Portugal-43%; Romania-36%; Spain-33%; Malta-20%. At this question we also have an important number of votes for "I DON'T KNOW" from Romania (27%) and Malta (15%). Portugal answered again with 0% for "NOTHING". Independence has become generally



a necessary condition in today's society and also in the sentimental relationships even though sometimes the students seem not to be sure how to approach this problem.




Intimate relations were not very approved by students in every country, percentages varying excepting Malta, with 53%-,, A LOT" answers. 




To the question number 16, students in Malta preferred to answer with "STRONGLY DISAGREE"-51% same as Spain-48% . ,DISAGREE" was the first choice for Portugal-38%; Romania-32%; Italy-27%. #### 23. Violence implicates physical abuse only.












### 25. Insults are a form of violence


#### 26. Even girls can be violent with their partners.



### 28. Violence means losing control.





# **29.** A girl cannot change her partner's violent behavior with tenderness and patience.






#### **30.** In a relationship teasing your partner does not mean to hurt him/her.











To this question, most students considered solidarity very important in life, in a percentage of 71% in Portugal, 52% in Malta, 50% in Spain, 34% in Romania and 28% in Italy. But, there was a moderate percent in Romania (36%) and in Italy (34%) who answered I don't know. However, most of students this concept of solidarity is important in human interaction, in social life.




